

### ***May: A Month of Composers***

Charles Gounod was a respected Parisian composer in the 19th century. Once, while playing the well-known Prelude in C by Bach (the first work in the "Well-Tempered Clavier"), he improvised a melody above the original piece, and his father-in-law wrote it down. In a way, these two composers collaborated across an interval of 150 years. The resulting combined work has been published as an instrumental, and with different sets of words added to it. It is now usually sung with the traditional text praising Mary, the mother of Jesus. Happy Mother's Day!


