Shostakovich Piano Concerto No 2 - 3. Movement - Allegro Shostakovich was probably the most important Soviet composer, famous for trying to both undermine and support the USSR through his music. Like many composers in the Eastern bloc, he was expected to write accessible and interesting music for children and amateurs. This concerto is often performed by younger players (though it's also done by professionals), though not usually this young! This girl seems to have won a competition, allowing her to play a concerto with the national orchestra in Qatar. If the rhythm sounds funny, it's because it's in 7, usually counted in a fast 1+2+3+a.

Bach + Swingle (Musical Offering, 6-part Ricercar) You might remember the Swingle Singers, who would do a cappella versions of classical pieces. Here they, along with the Modern Jazz Quartet, do a 6-part fugue by Bach in a record from 1968.
