HURRICANE HELENE: LUTHERAN DISASTER RESPONSE

Hurricane Helene hit the coast of Florida as a Category 4 hurricane on Sept. 26 and has ravaged communities in the southeast, from Florida to Virginia. As the floodwaters have started to recede, the extreme devastation — especially in North Carolina and Tennessee — has become clearer. Entire towns, roads and bridges have been washed away, and millions remain without power and cell service.

“...I do know,” says the Rev. Timothy Smith, bishop of the North Carolina Synod. “Lutheran Disaster Response, in partnership with our synod, along with other helpers, will be there for the long haul, and we will rally around our congregations, camps, and communities.”

[Trio Gaspard | J. Haydn: Klaviertrio C-Dur / Piano Trio in C major](#) Franz Joseph Haydn was a court musician all his life, and his music never fails to be charming, surprising, and even funny (things his employer, Prince Nicolaus, wanted from his pet composer). This is the first-prize-winning performance for a chamber music competition by the Trio Gaspard, who have gone on to much success. Chamber groups in classical music often have names like this (e.g., the Emerson String Quartet), and the name remains even as membership changes over the years, sometimes with no original members remaining. The Trio Gaspard still has two of these players in it – the pianist has changed.

[Michael McCabe - Trumpet Tune in A Major](#) On Sunday, we did “Hilariter,” by Michael McCabe. I didn’t know him before, but I liked that piece. Here’s an organ work in a similar style – lots of changing meter make it a bit hard to snap your fingers to, but I like the wonky resulting feel.
